

## Analysis of our 2011 SATs results – Edwalton Primary School

### **Key Stage 1**

- Performance improved in 2011 and is now **significantly above** national average for average points scores overall and in Mathematics and **well above** in Reading.
- Percentage at L2+ is **above** the national average in Reading, Writing and Mathematics and at L3.
- The performance of the Boys is **above** the Girls overall and **well above** Boys nationally and **well above** in Mathematics.
- FSM pupils performance is **significantly above** similar pupils nationally overall and in Writing and Mathematics.

### **Key Stage 2**

- A **very significant improvement** in the average point score in 2011 and is now **significantly above** overall and in Mathematics.
- Percentage L4+ and L5 are **significantly above** the national average in Mathematics and in English and Mathematics combined.
- Boys performance is in line with the Girls overall and **significantly above** Boys nationally.
- The FSM pupils performance is **well above** similar pupils nationally overall and **significantly above** in Mathematics.
- The SEN School Action pupils **well above** similar pupils nationally overall and **significantly above** in Mathematics.
- The Girl's performance was **below** Girls nationally at L5 in English.
- The Boy's performance was **significantly above** Boys nationally at L5 in English and Mathematics.
- The FSM Pupils performed **well below** similar pupils nationally at L5 in English but **well above** in Mathematics.
- All ability groups performed **well above/significantly above** in Mathematics at L5.
- Progress is **significantly above** expectation overall and in Mathematics especially the Middle and Upper ability Boys groups.

**This demonstrates that for 2011 the school is performing significantly above the national value added score and is in the top 25% of schools nationally. This is a wonderful achievement for a truly inclusive school filled with children of many different ethnic groups, backgrounds and socio-economic considerations. This is testimony to the hard work of everyone, children, parents, staff and governors. Well done. Now we aim to be in the top 20% of schools nationally.**
